On Tuesday evening, we held an evening of training and commissioning for around fifty children of the parish. These children were nominated by their teachers and their peers to take on the ministry of proclaiming the Word at school masses. They gathered together with Fr. Efren and Christine for an hour of learning about how to proclaim the Word at mass. Then, with their parents and parishioners present, they joined us for the 7 pm mass where Fr. Efren commissioned them as lectors. The parish will continue to provide them with ongoing formation and training. We were so pleased to have so many families participate.

# The Passport Office

You have likely noticed the "Passport Office" located at the back of the church for the past few weeks and perhaps you are wondering exactly what is going on. This is a new part of our First Eucharist and Confirmation preparation programme this year. We have "issued" passports to all the children preparing for sacraments as they make the "journey" to the celebration of the sacrament. Children get their passports stamped as they engage in the various disciples of Christian life. There are five categories of discipleship that we are asking the children to pay attention to this year: belonging to a Christian community, engaging in communal worship on Sundays, developing a personal prayer and devotional life, taking on service in the Church and community and learning about their faith. As they get their passports stamped in all of these areas, the children and their parents are able to reflect on and deepen their faith life.
