

#### Tax Receipts



What you need to know about your 4 2017 tax receipts...

- They will be available after all the masses this weekend and next weekend at the back of the church and at the office during the week.
- ◆ If you switched to using your credit card to make your donations, those donations will be receipted by the Archdiocese. That amount is not included in your receipt from St. John's.
- ◆ If you made a donation to St. Vincent de Paul, you will receive a separate receipt from them.
- ♦ If you made a donation to the Family of Faith campaign, you will receive your receipt from the Archdiocese.
- ◆ If you made a ShareLife donation to St. John's, the amount is included in your receipt. However if you used your credit card to make that donation, the Archdiocese will send you a receipt for the ShareLife portion.
- ♦ In line with privacy law, we will not give out receipts for third parties, including family members. These are sensitive and confidential documents and only the people whose name is on the receipt can receive them, even if more than one person contributes under the same envelope.
- We remind every one that processing a replacement copy of a tax-receipt requires the work of an accountant which incurs additional cost to the parish. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

#### From the Accounting Office

We ask that **registered parishioners** please do not use the PINK visitor envelopes for offertory. These are meant to be used by visitors only. If you do not have envelopes, we encourage you to come to the parish office and pick up a box of weekly offertory envelopes.

#### The Three Pillars of Cent

In the season of lent, the church provides us with three disciplines to help us grow in the spiritual life. These "pillars" of lent are Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. Jesus teaches us that to give alms, means to make the needs of others our own. We are especially called to provide for the most vulnerable people in our world: children and the old, the sick and the suffering, families and individuals, next-door neighbours and people in lands faraway. Whatever we give should be something of ourselves, something that costs us. We follow in the example of Christ who gave his life for us that we might live. This is why fasting and almsgiving go together. We fast to recognize our privilege. We fast to recognize the suffering of our brothers and sisters who have less than we. And we fast to remind ourselves of our hunger for God. As we fast, we hope to nurture a spirit of gratitude and a spirit of generosity. However, we cannot do any of this without strengthening our relationship with God in prayer which grounds us and strengthens us. This Lent, we invite the parish community to join in the practice of these pillars of Lent:

Give and Fast: During the Fridays of Lent, you are encouraged to give up your dinner budget and donate it to the poor. In turn, you and your family are invited to join us for soup and bread from 5pm to 6:30pm in the Parish Hall. An alms-giving box will be set out to receive donations that will be used to feed the poor through Community Bread.

**Pray**: After the meal, all are welcome to pray with the community by attending the Stations of the Cross at 7pm in the Church.

#### Reconciliation Tree



The call to conversion makes perfect sense when we embrace it with concrete actions. We can pray. fast and take care of the

poor, but these are essentially easy tasks to perform. The real work of conversion happens when we take steps towards reconciliation with those whom we have not forgiven or have not asked to forgive us. As a parish community, we are invited to seek new ways of reconciliation.
