Celebrating the Scrutinies

On the 2nd, 3rd and 4th Sundays of lent, we celebrate the Scrutiny Rites with the people preparing for initiation at Easter. The three weeks of scrutiny address three kinds of sin in our lives. The first week we hear the story of the woman at the well. In this story, Jesus confronts the woman with her sinful past - a history of broken relationships. This is a story of the healing of a woman from individual sin. The second week we hear the story of Jesus healing the man born blind. Because he is blind, the community around him assumes he has sinned in some way and, for that reason, excludes and judges him. In curing the man, Jesus not only heals his physical blindness, but challenges the attitudes of the community. This is a story of the healing of a community from social sin. In the third and final week we are told the story of the raising



of Lazarus from the dead. The ultimate consequence of our sin is death and this week we are reminded that in Jesus even death is overcome. As St. Paul tells us, death has no real sting for Christians. Because of Jesus, we need not fear any kind of sin - even the sin that leads to death. This is a story of the healing of all of humanity from radical sin and death. The celebration of these scrutinies is not only for the people joining our Christian community for the first time. It is an opportunity for each and every one of us to examine the kinds of sin which prevent us from living fully as followers of Jesus.

Living the Gospel


Pray for Vocations
