The Season of Lent



Each year, the Church provides us with the opportunity to renew

our commitment to live as a follower of Christ. This happens at the Easter liturgies when we renew our baptismal promises. Do we actually still believe in the message of Christ with all our hearts? Do we still reject evil and sin with all our being? If we take this renewal seriously, we know we have fallen short. We must repent of attitudes and behaviours which keep us from being faithful disciples. We are in need of conversion. Jesus taught us what we need to enable this conversion when he spoke about prayer, fasting and giving. Each year, on Ash Wednesday, we read about these disciplines and how to engage in them in a healthy and fruitful fashion. Prayer connects us to the Source of Life where we are challenged to grow and where we experience merciful love. Fasting and almsgiving help us realize our dependence on God and help us to develop compassion for those who have less than we do. Almsgiving also helps us to make a very real difference in people's lives.

In the parish, we offer a number of opportunities for you to pray, fast and give. During the Fridays of Lent, we invite you to join us for Solidarity Soup in which we eat a simple meal together as a community and donate the budget of our dinner to the poor. Join us again, this Friday, March 15 from 5pm to 6:30pm. After the meal, there is an opportunity for prayer as we celebrate our Healing Mass at 7pm in the church. On all other Fridays we will pray the Stations of the Cross.
