

# **Supporting ShareLife**

May 5 is ShareLife Sunday. Our Goal this year is \$89,000 which our parish takes on with courage, especially since our ShareLife parish is one of the leading supporting parishes. As of last week we are at %44 of our Goal with a total of \$39,070 collect-

ed. Join us in Living the Gospel by supporting ShareLife. Rashida endured years of domestic abuse while living in Egypt. Fearing her husband would abuse their children, she successfully applied for refugee status in Canada. Rashida arrived in Toronto, not knowing the language, what to do, or who could help. Fortunately, she met an Arabic speaker who told her about Catholic Cross-cultural Services (CCS). CCS helped her navigate the immigration process and access the resources she needed. "CCS saved my life," Rashida says. "Today I have money of my own, an apartment, and my children are finally safe and happy." May 5 is ShareLife Sunday. Please give generously.
