



- Do not use your old envelopes from previous years, please destroy them as those numbers will be used by someone else.
- Fill in your name and address on each envelope for the first month when you start using your 2021 box of envelopes.
- The number on your box of envelopes is designated for your use only.
- Please do not give your envelopes to anyone else outside of your household.

WORSHIP SAFE GUIDELINES

The Eventbrite link to register is on the parish website. Click on: "Register for Mass" and complete the registration.

- ◆ Each person in your household, who will be attending needs to be registered individually.
- Registration is now mandatory for all weekend Masses, including the 12pm Spanish Mass.
- ◆ Capacity remains at 30%, Eventbrite registration limited to 80 people/Mass
- ◆ Registration is required for the celebrations of Solemnity and Feast Days.
- ◆ If you do not have access to the internet, please call the office, before 5 pm on Thursdays and we will register for you.
- ◆ There is absolutely **no singing** other than by the cantor. Singing potentially spreads airborne contagion a distance of

10 feet. Please do not sing.

- ◆ Everyone must continue to wear a face mask when inside the church. Masks must be in place when receiving the host and not removed till 6 feet away from the priest or deacon.
- ◆The host must be consumed before you return to your seat.
- **◆** Do not carry the host to your pew or outside of the church.
- ◆Volunteers are not required to register as they will not be occupying the pews.
- ♦ We ask parishioners to selfassess before coming to all masses. Simply copy and paste the link below, into your browser, for complete selfassessment information.

- ◆ For your safety, washrooms are closed till further notice.
- ◆arrive 30 minutes or more before mass begins so our volunteers have time to welcome, screen and direct you to your seat.
- ◆doors will be locked when mass starts and you will have to register for another mass if you arrive late.
- ◆ Anyone with mobility issues will be moved to the front of the line and seated in designated pews.
- ◆ Seating is not optional and will be assigned. Parishioners are asked to remain in the seat assigned to them to respect the safety of others.



DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY APRIL 11




During the course of Jesus' revelations to Saint Faustina on the Divine Mercy He asked on numerous occasions that a feast day be dedicated to the Divine Mercy and that this feast be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. The liturgical texts of that day, the second Sunday of Easter, concern the institution of the Sacrament of Penance, the Tribunal of the Divine Mercy, and are thus already suited to the request of Our Lord. This Feast, which had already been granted to the nation of Poland and been celebrated within Vatican City, was

granted to the Universal Church by Pope John Paul II on the occasion of the canonization of Sr. Faustina on 30 April 2000. Our Lord wants to teach us the story of His Love and how it remains with us even until death. Our Lord gave Sister Faustina the prayers of the chaplet of Divine Mercy.

The Divine Mercy novena begins on Good Friday and ends on Divine Mercy Sunday April 11. To access the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy Novena online. visit: https://bit.ly/3rt5JiH

For each of the nine days, our Lord gave Saint Faustina a different intention: All mankind, especially sinners; the souls of priests and religious; all devout and faithful souls; those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Jesus; the souls who have separated themselves from the Church; the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children; the souls who especially venerate and glorify His mercy; the souls detained in purgatory; and souls who have become lukewarm.



"I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw there from strength and refreshment and whatever grace they have need of in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209).

My dear friends,

I pray that you and your loved ones are healthy and managing through these challenging days. For many, it feels as though our Lenten journey has been a year long period of sacrifice and penance.

At this time last year, we were in the early days of the pandemic and experienced a very different kind of Holy Week. Once again this year, we will not be able to gather in large numbers for the Triduum as significant restrictions announced today will continue in all areas of the Archdiocese of Toronto.

In the midst of this spiritual distress, we must not lose sight that through the storm we are experiencing, Jesus remains the way, the truth and the life. I know that so many of you have found opportunities to be the face and hands of Christ through this pandemic; caring for people who are isolated or marginalized, serving as ambassadors of compassion and love while having the opportunity to reflect on what is truly important in our lives.

While we are all feeling drained by the restrictions in place, we know that these are temporary measures with a beginning and an end. Sadly, the number of positive Covid-19 cases in our province are on the rise once again with more than 7,000 lives lost and many sick in hospital. We pray that health and safety measures, along with vaccinating the public as soon as possible will allow us to gather together without restrictions to celebrate the Eucharist, the source and summit of our faith.

I fully recognize that this Holy Week, it is frustrating for many Catholics in our archdiocese who were unable to reserve a space for services. Thank you for your patience and understanding. The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass remains in place at this time. We are grateful to our clergy and parish staff with many parishes adding additional services to accommodate as many as possible. I also extend my gratitude to the thousands of volunteers who have worked so faithfully to ensure that our churches remain a safe place to gather in prayer.

While it is not a substitute for in-person participation in the sacraments, for those unable to join us at church, I encourage you to view the televised services offered through the National Catholic Broadcasting Council, Salt & Light Catholic Media or EWTN as well as the many livestream services made available through our parishes. You can also view Triduum services at St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica or journey with a <a href="wirtual Stations of the Cross produced by St. Michael's Choir School. Be assured that all priests of the archdiocese, myself included, will be keeping your intentions close in prayer this week.

May the Easter hope that accompanies the risen Christ serve as a reminder of the joy that we will experience collectively when these days of pandemic are no more. May God continue to bless you in a special way this Holy Week.




