

Therefore, when we face trials in our stewardship, let us turn to Jesus and ask Him to help us overcome our struggles just as He did during His time on earth.

# VACCINATION POLICY FOR CLERGY, STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS

On September 24, Thomas Cardinal Collins, Archbishop of Toronto, in response to the request to all organizations, business. communicated the following Archdiocesan policy for Staff, Volunteers and Clergy.

Both Cardinal Collins and the Holy Father strongly urge every Catholic to become fully vaccinated as 'the morality of vaccination depends not only on the duty to protect one's own health, but also on the duty to pursue the common good".

Be assured that every effort will be made to ensure places of worship remain open and accessible to all, regardless of vaccination status.

To ensure a safe workplace and to welcome the faithful with an additional lever of health and safety, on a temporary basis, the Archdiocese is asking that all Clergy, Staff and Volunteers, who are those with the greatest person to person interaction in parish/office settings and thus, a heightened risk for transmission of Covid-19, be fully vaccinated or be subject to regular rapid tests.

Prior to serving in your volunteer role, you are asked to provide official proof of vaccination to our Volunteer Screening

Co-ordinator, Theresa McNicol, at screeningstjc@archtoronto.org, as we are required to keep a log of vaccination status, noting only name and date of 2<sup>nd</sup> vaccination. If you are unable to do so by email, please call 905-898-4137, ext. 202, to book an appointment with Theresa where you can provide an official paper record of your 2<sup>nd</sup> vaccination.

Please also advise Theresa of all parish groups/ministries you volunteer in.

We do need to 'see' your proof of vaccination but, will not retain or make copies of any proof of vaccination.

The log will be stored in a secure location and collected, used and disclosed ONLY for the purposes of administering infection control procedures as required by law. Once it is no longer needed in relation to Covid 19, it will be destroyed.

Individuals can download their 2<sup>nd</sup> vaccination receipt at:

https://covid19.ontariohealth.ca.

This allows you to download a PDF copy which can be emailed, printed or kept on your mobile device.

**Unvaccinated** volunteers will still be permitted to continue in ministry, but only with regular rapid test results to be shared with the volunteer co-ordinator, or parish representative, on a prearranged day each week or **prior to their scheduled volunteer shift**. Record of negative results will be kept in your volunteer file until we are directed by the Archdiocese to destroy them.

Rapid tests available through participating drug stores are acceptable. These tests are administered at the pharmacy with results available within 15 minutes, at a cost of about \$40/test.

# CATHOLIC BISHOPS OF CANADA APOLOGIZE TO THE INDIGENOUS PEOPLES OF THIS LAND

Sep-24-2021

We, the Catholic Bishops of Canada, gathered in Plenary this week, take this opportunity to affirm to you, the Indigenous Peoples of this land, that we acknowledge the suffering experienced in Canada's Indian Residential Schools. Many Catholic religious communities and dioceses participated in this system, which led to the suppression of Indigenous languages, culture and spirituality, failing to respect the rich history, traditions and wisdom of Indigenous Peoples. We acknowledge the grave abuses that were committed by some members of our Catholic community; physical, psychological, emotional, spiritual, cultural, and sexual. We also sorrowfully acknowledge the historical and ongoing trauma and the legacy of suffering and challenges faced by Indigenous Peoples that continue to this day. Along with those Catholic entities which were directly involved in the operation of the schools and which have already offered their own heartfelt apologies¹, we², the Catholic Bishops of Canada, express our profound remorse and apologize unequivocally.

We are fully committed to the process of healing and reconciliation. Together with the many pastoral initiatives already underway in dioceses across the country, and as a further tangible expression of this ongoing commitment, we are pledging to undertake fundraising in each region of the country to support initiatives discerned locally with Indigenous partners. Furthermore, we invite the Indigenous Peoples to journey with us into a new era of reconciliation, helping us in each of our dioceses across the country to prioritize initiatives of healing, to listen to the experience of Indigenous Peoples, especially to the survivors of Indian Residential Schools, and to educate our clergy, consecrated men and women, and lay faithful, on Indigenous cultures and spirituality. We commit ourselves to continue the work of providing documentation or records that will assist in the memorialization of those buried in unmarked graves.

Having heard the requests to engage Pope Francis in this reconciliation process, a delegation of Indigenous survivors, Elders/knowledge keepers, and youth will meet with the Holy Father in Rome in December 2021. Pope Francis will encounter and listen to the Indigenous participants, so as to discern how he can support our common desire to renew relationships and walk together along the path of hope in the coming years. We pledge to work with the Holy See and our Indigenous partners on the possibility of a pastoral visit by the Pope to Canada as part of this healing journey.

We commit ourselves to continue accompanying you, the First Nations, Métis and Inuit Peoples of this land. Standing in respect of your resiliency, strength and wisdom, we look forward to listening to and learning from you as we walk in solidarity. 24 September 2021
