THE SISTERS OF ST. PETER CLAVER



The Sisters of St. Peter Claver will be visiting our Parish next weekend. Their Congregation began in Austria in 1894, and their specific mission is to support Missionaries. Originally, they helped missions in Africa and abolishment of slavery. Then in the 1960s they opened the door to all the mission countries. Internationally they have 45 houses with one house in Canada, in Toronto. They continue to support the Missions and organize fundraising through visiting Parishes and speaking about the needs - spiritual, material, personal - of the Mission Countries. This year they are appealing for **The Daughters of Providence for Blind and Deaf** in Sri Lanka who are looking after 85 children of whom 30 are in their Hostels. They will be come to our parish with their Claver Calendars, Rosaries and Christmas Cards (recycled paper) all handmade made by them (available in English, Spanish and Polish) and some literature on St. Peter

Claver (their Patron Saint), Blessed Mary Theresa Ledóchowska, (their Foundress). They will be accepting donations for the Missions for these items, at the end of every Mass

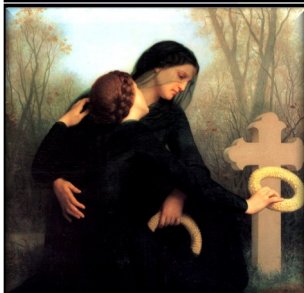
