Carlos will celebrate his first Mass as a priest here at St. John's today Sunday, May 14th at the 10:00 am Mass. OBTAIN THE FIRST MASS INDULGENCE To obtain the plenary indulgence, first you must have the intention to gain it. Then you must participate in the newly-ordained Priest's First Mass and receive the Holy Eucharist. In addition, you must receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), make a profession of faith (recite either the Apostles' or the Nicene Creed), and pray for the Holy Father and for his intentions (an Our Father, a Hail Mary, and a Glory Be are recommended). It is also required that all attachment to sin, even venial sin. be absent. Confession and the recitation of the Creed may be fulfilled several days before or after. It is, however, fitting that Communion be received and the prayer for the intention of the Sovereign Pontiff be said on the same day the work is performed. The indulgence may be applied for yourself or for the soul of a dearly departed, but not both. For more information on indulgences, please read, the Catechism of the Church, paragraphs #1471-1479

HOST A UKRAINIAN FAMILY

When hearing reports of the war in Ukraine, and the millions of Ukrainians that have been forced to flee their homeland, many have asked what they can do to help. Over 200,000 Ukrainians have already arrived in Canada through a special visa program created by Immigration Canada. An additional 800,000 have applied to the program and are expected to arrive in the coming months. Many are arriving to Toronto and are without family here in Canada to help them. Among those will be some who are vulnerable to human trafficking, particularly seniors, single women, and women with children. There is an immediate need for families to host for a period of between one and six months some of those who have arrived. 
