DEVOTION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

The month of June is dedicated to the devotion of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The devotion to the Sacred Heart has historical-

ly been, and continues to be, one of the most popular and widespread devotions for all Catholics worldwide.

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus - also the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests - is celebrated on the Friday after the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. This suggests to us that the Eucharist (Corpus Christi) is none other than the Heart of Jesus himself, of the One who "takes care of us" with his "heart".

Pope Pius IX made it an obligatory throughout the universal feast Church in 1856. In 1995, Saint John Paul II instituted the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests on this same day so that the priesthood might be protected in the hands of Jesus, so it could be open to everyone.

Prayer to the Sacred Heart

O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer you my prayers, works, joys and sufferings of this day for all of the intentions of your Sacred Heart, in union with the holy sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, in thanksgiving for your favours, in reparation for my sins, for the intentions of all my relatives and friends, and in particular for the intentions of the Holy Father. Amen. O Sacred Heart of Jesus. I place all my trust in you
