DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE

Development and Peace invites

all St. John Chrysostom parish-

ioners to express their commitment to supporting human and environmental rights by signing a petition to the Federal Government **after Masses on February 1st/2nd**. The petition calls for due diligence legislation for Canadian companies operating abroad. Human rights and environmental abuses continue to devastate the lives of peasant and indigenous farmers in the Global South. Following the D&P "People and the Planet" Campaign in 2021/22, the Federal Government promised to pass due diligence legislation, but this has not happened. Let's remind them through this petition to fulfill their promise.

WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

The World Day of the Sick, observed on **February 11**, focuses on those suffering from illness, emphasizing their physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being. Established by Pope John Paul II in 1992, it raises awareness of the challenges faced by the sick and encourages compassion and care. Coinciding with the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, a pilgrimage site for healing, the day this year highlights healthcare workers, solidarity, and the need for better access to healthcare worldwide. It calls on communities to unite in prayer, support those in need, and advocate for policies that uphold the dignity and health of all people.
