Formed through St. Augustine's Seminary and Redemptoris Mater Missionary Seminary, these men are nearing the final stage of their vocation. All are welcome to attend, and the faithful across the Archdiocese are encouraged to pray for them and all in formation, asking the Lord to guide and strengthen them on their journey.



MEMORIAL OF SAINT JOHN CHRYSOSTOM BISHOP AND DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH SATURDAY, SEPT 13, 2025

Saint John Chrysostom was a convert, a devoted deacon, a powerful priest, an influential archbishop, and a gifted writer—earning him the title of Doctor of the Church. Beyond his pastoral work, he left a legacy of around 700 sermons, countless letters, scriptural commentaries, and theological writings, especially on the Eucharist and priesthood, which still shape the Church today. As we honor this "golden -mouthed" preacher, consider your own need for clear and faithful teachers of the faith. Reflect on how you can better engage with the Church's rich catechetical tradition to deepen your understanding and grow spiritually. By seeking out wise voices and solid teaching, we open ourselves to God's ongoing work in our lives.


