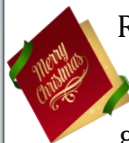

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY (JAN 18-25)



The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is celebrated worldwide each year from January 18-25, inviting Christians to pray for healing, reconciliation, and unity in the Body of Christ, as Jesus prayed: "that they may all be one" (John 17:21). This year's theme, "There is one body and one Spirit" (Ephesians 4:4), highlights Christian unity as a calling of the Holy Spirit. The prayers and reflections were prepared by Christian communities in Armenia, the first nation to embrace Christianity, offering a powerful witness of faith, hope, and unity amid suffering. A regional ecumenical prayer service will be held on **Sunday, January 18, 2026, at 4:00 p.m.** at **Runnymede United Church, Toronto**, hosted by the Office for Ecumenical and Interfaith Relations and the GTA Council of Christian Churches.
